Residential Swimming Pool <u>Requirements Prior to Permit Issuance</u>

- Provide two stamped, and signed engineered pool construction plans to comply with current California State adopted Building Codes and Riverside County Ordinances.
- Additional construction such as slides, raised rock coping, grottos, etc...shall be provided with stamped, signed construction details.
- Pool construction plans shall be highlighted for soil conditions and applicable construction details.
- The swimming pool plan submittal shall include three site plans drawn to scale and showing all property lines.
 In addition, the site plans shall include:

In addition, the site plans shall include:

- a) All structure locations on the property.
- b) Proposed pool location
- c) Pool equipment location.
- d) Pool fencing location and fencing type shall comply with current local and state requirements
- e) All distances shall be indicated from property lines, existing / proposed structures, and sewage disposal systems (all components of the pool and pool equipment including diving boards, water slides, valves, timers, gas and/or electric service shall be located a minimum of 5 feet from any property line or structure). Pool heaters may require longer setbacks and shall be located per the manufactures specification or CMS, which ever is more restrictive.
- Provide the signed pool fence agreement letter.
- Where the permit applicant is not the property owner or California licensed contractor, a signed authorization letter from the property owner or California licensed contractor is required with the name of the authorized person(s) identified.
